Dr. Dulaney has remarkable credentials, having received a medical degree (M.D.) from Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University, Providence, RI. During his third year of medical school, Dr. Dulaney was chosen to attend the prestigious Charles A. Dana Foundation Clinical Research Training Program at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, Philadelphia, PA. Upon his graduation from medical school, Dr. Dulaney completed a one-year medical internship at The Miriam Hospital, Providence, RI. Dr. Dulaney subsequently completed a three-year residency in neurology at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, PA; a one-year fellowship in epilepsy and clinical neurophysiology at The Cleveland Clinic Foundation, Cleveland, OH; a one-year fellowship in electromyography and neuromuscular diseases at the University Hospitals of Cleveland/Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine, Cleveland, OH; a three-year residency in anatomic pathology at Fletcher Allen Health Care (academic medical center), Burlington, VT; and a one-year fellowship in dermatopathology at Fletcher Allen Health Care, Burlington, VT.

Since earning his medical degree, Dr. Dulaney served in a series of key positions within both the academic and clinical arenas, including the following:
